Statistician: We have had some great turnouts so far this year. Through the end of May last year, we had completed 53 tournaments with 1,179 pitchers, 85,960 ringers and 277,157 shoes pitched. This year, through the end of May, we completed 48 tournaments with 1,188 pitchers, 83,816 ringers and 278,302 shoes pitched. This year we had 7 cancelled tournaments and only one cancelled tournament last year. I hate to keep bringing this up but there are still some people sending their tournament results to Gail Sluys instead of to me. **Gail gets the money, I get the results**.

I have developed some new Master Summary Charts for those of you that still do your tournaments by hand. I have a separate chart for 4 person round robin with enough room for a double round and space to record a 3 way tie. I have separate charts for 5-person and 7 person round robins with the "byes" built in and space for a 3-way tie. The 8-person chart has room for a 3-way tie also. All of the charts have a space to enter the sanction number, tournament name, class, tournament location, date, entry average of each pitcher and the

handicap for handicapped games. Any club that would like to have copies of these charts can contact me and I will send you copies.

History of the San Francisco Horseshoe Pitching Club How I got involved with the GG Park horseshoe pits.

I have always enjoyed pitching horseshoes and grew up pitching horseshoes and playing bocce ball at all our family parties in the town of Sonoma. In the summer of 2008 I participated in my first organized recreational horseshoe pitching tournament at Donner Lake and thoroughly enjoyed it. I now live in San Francisco, where my parents were both from and wanted to play some horseshoes after coming home from my weekend tournament at the lake. So, I did what everyone does today and Googled 'horseshoe pitching San Francisco' and found NOTHING, and that was the start of my mission. I couldn't believe that in a city I consider to be the greatest in the world because San Francisco has everything you can imagine, but it didn't have a horseshoe pitching club. I continued to scour the internet search engines Google, MSN, and Yahoo! looking for something to come up on horseshoe pitching in San Francisco, and still found nothing. I looked for about a month and decided that was ridiculous and had to end. San Francisco is the second most densely populated city in America with close to 800,000 people living in 46.7 square miles or about 17,000 people per square mile. I couldn't be the only person who pitched horseshoes and since I couldn't find them, I thought I'd let them find me by creating a web page. I had recently heard of a website called www.wetpaint.com that allows you to set up a free website so on a whim I did just that on August 21st 2008. I had never done this before, but it was easy enough. Once I built the site I purchased the URL's www.sfhorseshoepitching.com (after the NHPA example) and www.sfhorseshoes.com (which automatically redirects to the main website). That costs about \$30/year, but it allowed me free drop

www.sfhorseshoepitching.wetpaint.com URL for a more recognizable one. The next step was to register the site with the various search engines so they would find it through a process the call 'web crawling'. One day after a couple of weeks it showed up on MSN! It was several pages down, but it was there. Then the others came shortly after and have been gradually moving up the search list.

In the meantime while doing all the web research, I obviously came across the NHPA and NCHPA, where I got the email address of Casey Sluys. Casey was like the lifeline of someone trapped in a cave wondering if anyone was really out there. That was very helpful

because I was doing all this work, put it up online and then had no idea if anyone was actually looking at it. Even though Casey was a bit skeptical when I first contacted him and told him I was going to start the SFHPC, his comment was, 'that's great...good luck with that', and not too optimistically. But that wasn't too much of a deterrent, because I wasn't planning on relying only on luck. The other glaringly obvious thing to me in my brief period of research is that organized horseshoe pitching is woefully marketed and advertised. I also knew that if I, the owner of an architecture firm, was spending a lunch hour at my desk, and typing 'horseshoes San Francisco' in google, that there were definitely others. Now that I've added a site meter to my website I know that is exactly what is happening. 11am – 2 pm and 5pm-7pm are when I get the most hits. When people are sitting at their desks wishing they were somewhere else.

Also from looking at the information I could find on horseshoe pitching I was confident I could eventually build one of the best horseshoe pitching websites in the country. Not that I'm a great website designer, but because almost nobody else had one! That was shocking. The NCHPA considers the 40 something's to be the 'young folks'. Not that I don't mind feeling like a kid again, but there seems to be several generations out there that are being ignored. Wouldn't it be nice if clubs were announcing NEW members as frequently as members who have passed away? There are hundreds of teens, 20's, and 30 something's out there twittering, facebooking and doing all their social networking and information gathering online. If clubs do not have an online presence, young people will not find them. That, I think is the key to the rapid success of SFHPC. I put it in a format where people could find it. It's created a nucleus for all kinds of people to congregate and find each other. The other thing I tried to do was pick a club name and design a logo

that is recognizable, obvious and brandable. The old club was called the Golden Gate club, but nobody would find that. You'd search for your "location, activity", i.e. "San Francisco, Horseshoe Pitching". This also gives the club regional pride. Couple that with a cool logo and you have a brand that people can identify with and hopefully want to be a part of.

The first week of April, 2009 Antonious Dintcho of BloodWizard Skateboard Company in San Francisco sent an email to Casey Sluys at the NCHPA asking questions about horseshoe pitching tournaments. Antonius is a World ranked skateboarder and grew up in Grass Valley, CA playing horseshoes. As a member of the San Francisco Skateboarder Association they had the idea of having a horseshoe tournament / Skate Jam fundraiser for building skateboard parks with horseshoe pits next to them. Casey referred him to me and my website. Blood Wizard promotes Skate Jam events so they had some sponsors and supporters, so they were responsible for the advertising to the skateboard community via web blogs, skate shops, bars, skateboard magazines and flyers. The SFHPA, (me) provided all the 'horseshoe' support. I posted their info on my site, and I provided all the tools and wheelbarrows to help them get the pits ready for the tournament. They were in terrible shape. One of my new members also came out and helped. This was the first wave of attacking the restoration of the Golden Gate horseshoe pits, but it had an impact. The local homeless residents came down and pitched horseshoes with the guys after working, and passersby would stop to see what was going on and to say good work. Community was After enabling the skateboarder volunteers to work on forming. digging out the overgrown pits, I reached out again to the NCHPA and contacted Casey, and Dave Loucks, who had also found my website online. I asked for NCHPA representation and backing and if they could get a former State Champion to come out as an ambassador of the sport. I figured if we had a world ranked skateboarded, we might as well have a top horseshoe pitcher there to represent the sport. NCHPA came through big with Kimmy Stockli and Rick Bermingham! Our tournament and club now had CREDIBILITY, that I could leverage in promoting the new club. Immediately we went from a basement computer hacker and picnic horseshoe club to a legitimate club with the power to draw State Champions. SFHPC became a real entity and the local expert resource for horseshoe pitching.

Having the NCHPA graciously support our grassroots tournament and club was the key move that has led to our next major development. The complete restoration of the Golden Gate Horseshoe Pits! This also goes back to creating an online presence and a way for people to find you, because through an act of providence, Jamie Sutton, one of the directors of the San Francisco philanthropic men's club The Guardsmen was driving through Golden Gate park and saw a small sign by the Conservatory of Flowers that said 'horseshoe pits'. Out of curiosity he searched to find the pits which is a difficult task because they are hidden and unmarked. Once he found the pits he realized that it was a beautiful spot he'd never known about and that people were trying to use them because some of pits had recently been cleared for play. After leaving with his curiosity peaked he went online to see if there was anything about horseshoe pitching in San Francisco and found the SFHPC website and saw the announcement about the Lord of the Ringer Tournament coming up that weekend. At the tournament, Jamie found me during one of my matches. I couldn't really talk since I was pitching, so I gave him one of the SFHPC business cards I'd made up for myself and all my new club members, and pointed him over to Kimmy and Rick and briefly explained their credentials to his pleasant surprise. They spoke to him for a long time and he left before I could speak to him again. That evening I sent him an email from the card he gave me welcoming to join the club. Four days later on May 21st, I received a 10:45 pm email asking if I could meet him, the Rec & Park Director of Volunteer Service, Park Director and the Director of Park Maintenance along with two Guardsmen at 7:30 AM to following day. I called him back that night and met him at the park in the morning. He explained that the Guardsmen wanted to take the horseshoe pits on as a project and to sponsor an annual fundraiser tournament in conjunction with the SFHPC. Once the park staff began to grasp the extent of what we were discussing, and how it was being financed they were on board and the wheels started Since then they have been very supportive and have followed through with work on their end and a significant amount of progress had already been made with heavy equipment moving sand and arborist clearing the overgrowth along with the first of three We have another Volunteer workday volunteer work days. scheduled for Saturday July, 11 and I am in frequent contact with the Guardsmen and Rec & Park. Lord of the Ringers Golden Gate Park

I was given the opportunity to represent the NHPA and Northern California HPA at a very unique horseshoe tournament. It was called the 1st Annual Lord of the Ringers Horseshoe Tournament, and was held at the historic Golden Gate Horseshoe Club in San Francisco's Golden Gate Park. Rick Bermingham, 2 time men's California State Champion and myself, 3 time Women's California State Champion, along with Kimmy's Horseshoe Shop were asked to come out and give a hand. We were told that we would be helping with a skateboarding horseshoe tournament. Rick and I. along with my Father Terry visiting from Wisconsin, drove in to Golden Gate Park, not knowing what to expect. We'd heard stories about how the Golden Gate courts had been taken over by the homeless back in the 1990's and that they were in very bad shape. A small group of folks, headed by Peter Zepponi, (see GG article this issue) were able to get half of the courts cleaned up to hold this great event. Upon arrival to the courts, it didn't look like there was going to be much of a turnout. All that were there at the time were the sponsors, one of them RockStar energy drink, and a few pitchers. After a couple of hours the place really filled up. They were limited to 32 teams of 2 players each and were able to fill all of the spaces. They probably could have had another 32 if they had all of the courts available and more time. Each of the teams had to pick a name, and there were several creative names that we shouldn't mention here! But, the winners were the Orange Gobblins. They played double elimination to 15 points per game, and leaners counted as two. The winning team received a great hand made trophy, and a pair of Diamonds, along with a good amount of cash. What was very different about this tournament was the fact that they had some great Rock and Roll going in the background and an awesome announcer keeping folks informed about what was going on. Along with the horseshoe pitching, on the other half of the courts, there were rails and ramps set up for the skateboarders to do some of their tricks. I couldn't believe the air that some of these guys were getting in such a small area. It was all very exciting to watch. By the time we were ready to leave, there had to be over 200 people there, families, with kids and pets, bbg's and ice chests. What an awesome scene.

On September 12th, 2009 there will be a benefit tournament held by the Guardsmen.org (see Peter's article) at the GG Horseshoe Club. Several sponsors are on board already, including Pabst Blue Ribbon. There will be free food and drinks. They will be taking 64 teams of 2 players. This event is not sanctioned at this time. It will be basic backyard rules. However, we may hold a 5 man round robin, NHPA rules, to show the public how our organization works. When we know more, we will pass it along to the membership. There will be work parties scheduled and we will inform your contact people about dates and times. Please help to get this beautiful club back up and running. Wouldn't it be awesome to have them on the schedule next year? Special thanks to Peter Zepponi for all of his hard work. If it isn't for him, none of this would have been possible. *Kimmy Stockli*
