

Recap of the Junior Boys 2014 Championship

The Junior Boys World Championship final game was perhaps one of the best horseshoe contests I have witnessed in my 28 years of attending the World Horseshoe Pitching Championships. It began with eight of the best in the world competing as a result of pitching high percentages in preliminary rounds in the Boys A class.

After the standard round robin of seven games there was a three way tie for first, between Ben Webb, KY, Brandon Pearl, NH and Hayden Lee, CA. As Hayden and Benn had a lower percentage than Brandon they had to play the first play off game. Hayden handily won by a score of 40-19 in 58 shoes. Then came the Championship game between two relative "new comers" to the game of horseshoes, Brandon's first year of competition and Hayden just entering his third year. Brandon began with a double ringer and Hayden with a double miss. Immediately the score was 6-0 Brandon, second inning 2 dead 1 for Brandon, third was 4 dead, fourth was 2 dead 1 for Brandon again, putting Hayden in a 8-0 hole. Hayden shook off the nerves and scored on a 3 ringers 3 but he stayed there until the 22nd shoe and Brandon was up to 14 points. Then Hayden held Brandon at 14 until the 30th shoe, the boys, scoring along the way, making it 18-15 Hayden at 30 shoes. It seemed as though Hayden had found his mark. The boys went back and forth to shoe 50 where the game was tied at 27. At shoe 64 it looked as though Brandon would put Hayden away as he scored making it 36 for Brandon and 33 for Hayden. At shoe 66 it became worse for Hayden as Brandon scored another 3 getting him to 39. But wait! Brandon misses one at shoe 68 and Hayden scores 3. With all the reserve Hayden could muster the boys toss a 4 dead at shoe 70. With Hayden crouching down, stretching his legs and shaking the nerves off he lines up his shoes and tosses a double Brandon needed to top at least one of them to hold Hayden at 39, BUT he missed both shoes giving Hayden 6 points and the win. Final score was Hayden 42 Brandon 39 in 72 shoes. Congratulations Hayden Lee of Santa Rosa! Casey Sluys

Last Saturday I loaned out horseshoes for a private 20 team tournament, and the following day, I helped manage the 6th Annual, Lord of the Ringer Horseshoe Tournament and Skate Jam put on by Blood Wizard Skateboard Company. We had 24 teams and several more people that came just for the portable skate park they set up. The team caliber definitely went up several notches this year, with teams coming in from Merced, Chowchilla, San Jose, Santa Rosa, San Rafael and the East Bay. The final matches were tough battles with Elias & Tino on team 'Horseshoes and Beer', from the South Bay coming out on top of the Frank Perez & Robert Stoker team 'Bad Habit' from the Merced Club in a tie breaker match. This was a double elimination, games to 21, win by two tournament where leaner's count! A whole lot of people playing horseshoes who had probably never heard of the NHPA before. Tournaments like the LOTR-6 get advertised and blogged about by websites and magazines, so the exposure of horseshoes in Golden Gate Park reaches a lot of people even if they are not there. Photos and videos will be posted on our website and Facebook page.

We're in our third year now and it seems every time I talk to Casey, Gail or one of the other club's officers' I'm learning something new. It's a difficult process learning by mistake and what seems like trying to recreate the wheel. Qualifying, dues, rules, scorecards, Natstats, raffles, clipboards, patches, brass plate, plagues, HS Master, News & Views, club shirts, donuts, coffee, handicapping, score keeping, delegates, club officers, bank accounts, on and on Horseshoe clubs are a lot more complicated than I would have ever thought 5 years ago.

We're starting to work on this ourselves in order to create a TO DO checklist for tournaments, but it could be expanded into club management and to create a schedule of milestone deadlines when things should be happening... Things like when you should submit articles to News & Views.

This might not even be a regional issue, but rather something that should be a master template created by NHPA, and modified locally. If it were not for everyone so generously helping us out and explaining things it'd would have been very difficult to get our club off the ground. Even established clubs can pick up new tips if people come up with a good idea. Why doesn't everyone send Casey their best club tip for the next News & Views and we'll see what's working?

We have a new Secretary, Matt Lusher, and we're talking about automated Paypal dues notices to our member list, and linking that to our club checking account. We haven't figured it all out yet, but when we do it could be good info to share. We'll make sure there is an 'associate member' option for people that want to be associates, as well as a 'donate' option for anyone that finds our website and just wants to donate to our work in the park. ...This is on the Year 4 Checklist.
