The organizers have contacted the NHPA/NCHPA and asked for our participation in this event. There will be over 1000 "athletes" participating during the course of the three days.

The way I envision this to work is to limit registration to 100 or so pitchers and pitch a double elimination over the three days. The finals would be held on Sunday, of course. The winners would receive some amount of prize money and be crowned the Pro-Am California State Champion Horseshoe Pitcher. There would be short-distanced group, a Junior group and a full-distanced group. Each group would receive money for first, second, and third places.

This will be a great opportunity to bolster the Shasta and the Willows HCs, we ought to be able to gain some new members from this and they could join those two clubs. Who knows; we may even have enough participants to begin a new club in Red Bluff? What do you say? Let's give it our best shot!

It's still real early in the planning stages, but you folks ought to plan to attend. There will be three television stations and at least one radio station covering the events for the weekend. We couldn't begin to ask for a better opportunity for publicity and if we all wear our club shirts to this event we would certainly stand out! The following are NCHPA By-Law change proposals for the November 4, 2006 Annual Meeting. Number 1 Article IV, Section 1—Members As it is read: "The E.C. shall be made up of the elected officers of the NCHPA". Add the words "and appointed" between the words (elected and officers). It will look like this: (The E.C. shall be made up of the elected and appointed officers of the NCHPA.)	Number 4 Article VII, Section (4)—Awards As it is read: "An awards banquet shall be held on the evening of the annual meeting and shall be run by the host club with the cooperation of the E.C". Change to read as follows: (An awards banquet shall be held either on the day of the annual meeting or the day of the NorCal Championship Tournament and shall be run by the host club.)
Number 2 Article IV, Section 3—Meetings Paragraph (c) As it is read: "The E.C. may conduct business by mail or telephone when necessary." Add "or e-mail" prior to the words (when necessary). It will look like this: (The E.C. may conduct business by mail or telephone or e-mail when necessary.)	Number 5 Article VIII, Section 1—NorCal Championships As it is read: "This shall be a two-day tournament." Change to read as follows: (This shall be a one or two day tournament, depending on the number of entries.)
Number 3 Article VII, Section (3)—Voting As it reads: "The President may decide on the method of voting except that there shall be no voting by mail". Add the words (e-Mail or Phone) It will look like this: (The President may decide on the method of voting except that there shall be no voting by mail, E-Mail or Phone.)	Second sentence. As it is read: "They may be adopted, changed or suspended by majority vote at any meeting without notice". Change it to the following: (They may be adopted, changed or suspended by a majority vote of seated delegates at the meeting, without notice.)
