Some thoughts on pitching more ringers. The pitchers that average 40% and above are people with pretty good fundamentals. The pitchers who are lower than 40% may need to assess their basic pitching motion. After getting lined up to throw your shoe, imagine a line from the peg coming back to your throwing arm and continuing straight behind you. If you watch the top pitchers, while standing directly behind them, you will see how there back swing comes straight back from the peg. This seems simple but if you do not start the proper motion backwards it will be hard to have a consistant forward alignment. But before starting your back swing you also need to mentally visualize where you want your hand to release at. If you can first master these two things it will also help your distance, height and shoe turn or flip. Then finally lots of practice at home helps you develop as a better pitcher. When your practicing with someone else it is hard assess your self and make adjustments. When you get several doubles in a row watch out for that giddy feeling, it will throw you off.
