The NCHPA 2022-2023 season started immediately after Labor Day 2022 and as of July 8 2023 NCHPA has pitched 73 tournaments (thru 03-23-067) and cancelled/postponed 17 tournaments. Eleven hundred twenty-nine NCHPA pitchers and 35 non-NCHPA pitchers have pitched in our tournaments to date. Stay healthy and keep on a' pitchin'!

Now that we are using eShoe you club statisticians may now upload your

tournament statistics (if using HSMaster) directly to eShoe any time after your tournament is complete, but you still must email me (meanderson99@yahoo.com) the comma-separated-values Results file (1 per tournament), the Class Boxscore files (1 per tournament class), and the All Class Standings Results file (1 per tournament) for my work. If you do not care to upload your tournament statistics to eShoe yourself then I will be glad to do it for you. Just let me know that you would like for me to do it. The files that you send me are the same files that I have always asked for you to send me. And please be sure that the boxscore files that you send are generated in HSMaster as Tournaments, Reports, Format, Results [not Results (Brief)]. Keep in mind that I need to see member numbers in every file that you send. That means I want the long version, not brief version, of every file. Note that for doubles tournaments HSMaster will produce only the brief version of the Class Boxscore files and the All Class Standings Results file.

These files can be produced in HSMaster by:

- 1) Open HSMaster (Version 1.1.232 or newer)
- 2) Create comma-separated-values Results file
- (Results03-<2 digit year>-<3 digit tournament number>.txt)

folder is C:/HSMasterData) Note that for doubles the class boxscore files do not have pitcher member numbers.

For those pitchers who pay their membership dues using NHPA eShoe and are not new members of NHPA be sure that you select that you are a returning old member and not a new member. Also for all

pitchers who pay their membership dues using NHPA eShoe remember to be an NCHPA member in good standing you must pay local club dues (if your local club requires it). NCHPA rules require all pitchers to be a member of a local club. Contact your local club representative to find out how much local dues are and where to send them. Thanks. *Mike Anderson*

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF 1964 TOURNAMENTS

- 1: All pitchers in NORTHERN and EAY AREA TOURNAMENTS must be NORTHERN ASSOCIATION MEMBERS.
- 2: Class 'A' .55% & above, Class 'B' 45 to 54.9%, Class 'C' 35 to 44.9% Class 'L' 25 to 34.0%, Class 'E' below 24.9%.
- 3: Any member who does not have an CFFICIAL 1963 AVERAGE, may establish an average by pitching five (5) games against any MORTHERN MEMBER and have these gemes scored by a third MEMPA member. These scores must be turned over to the NCHPA Secretary by a CLUB OFFICER. This average will enable the member to try for a tournament and if he makes the tournament, the averages that he pitches in that tournament will be his average for the rest of the year.
- 4: Qualifying for tournaments will be held from 10 A.M. 3 P.M. on the Scturday preceding the date of the tournament. Qualifying will also be held in the merning before the start of tournament play. Qualifying in the merning will end one (1) hour before the star
- 5: Qualifying a nd Entry fees shall be collected and retained by the MCRO CLUB, and they shall provide appropriate THROPHIES and/or PPILANS. Qualifying fees shall be, \$ 1,50 first attempt and \$ 1.00 for the second attempt. Entry gees for all NORTHEAN and BAY AREA TOURNAMENTS shall be \$ 2.00.
- 6: The LCOAL CIUB will take charge of their own sponsored tournaments and provide their own prizes and submit the summary sheet to the NCHPA secretary for completing.

Please make note on your schedules:

On September 9th tournament number 84, the *Sonoma County Club* has decided to eliminate the Mystery Money Open, instead we will hold a COUNT-ALL tournament that day.

The Lincoln Club has moved tournament number 91 from Sat. the 24th to Sunday the 25th.

Rules you can use:

Requirement 2 - All NHPA Tournaments and Leagues

Section E - Tournament Credit

- 1. For singles and doubles events, a contestant must have pitched a minimum of 100 shoes to receive eShoe credit. Exception: If all games of the round-robin schedule have been pitched in less than 100 shoes, these statistics may be submitted for eShoe credit.
- 2. In team tournament competitions, any team member who has pitched a minimum of one hundred (100) shoes during that event may receive eShoe credit.

3. For elimination tournaments, a contestant must pitch one hundred (100) or more shoes to receive eShoe credit for that event.

Section G Count-All

The Count-All System of scoring is to be optional throughout any sanctioned event. The exception to this shall be the World and State Championship Tournaments where only the preliminary qualifying rounds may use the count-all method of total points to determine the Championship Classes

Good for 2 weeks only!

During the World Tournament you'll be able to view the games on eShoe as soon as they're completed. Follow the directions sent to you in an NHPA Eblast. Or ask me. The good for 2 weeks is a misnomer because I'm sure the information will be archived for future reference. I love this new ability personally. www.horseshoepitching.com
