The NCHPA Championships will be in Vallejo this year.


The **Trophy Sponsorship** form is here for you to use. It benefits the NCHPA greatly with any of you assisting in the sponsorship of a State Championship Trophy.

Celebrating the Past and Looking Forward to the Future

Last month the Stockton Club held the Joe and Millie Schultz tournament. I've often said if we only held one tournament a year, it would be named in honor of Joe and Millie, considering all they have done for Stockton and Northern California Horseshoes. The "Joe and Millie" tournament always gives one pause to think of the "glory days" of Stockton Horseshoes, to remember the old club members, the great pitchers that have pitched on the Stockton Courts including Walter Ray, Jesse Gonzalez, Don Titcomb, Gerry Schneider, Ron Simmons, John Walker, Rick Bermingham, and Marcus Santillana. "Joe's Tournament", as Millie calls it, is always a day of nostalgia, remembering the club's founding, a day of celebrating the PAST. It turned out, however, that the day's celebration was not just about the PAST, but also about the FUTURE!! The FUTURE arrived in the presence of the smallest pitcher at the tournament that day, and the youngest. The FUTURE was brought to Louis Park by his family, his mom and dad.

The FUTURE was present in 7 year old Hastiin Begaye. He seemed like a friendly, polite little guy, so Joe Summers and I marked off the 20 foot Cadet Foul line for him on the courts he would play. He had an entry average 43 %....not bad for a Cadet we thought.....we had no idea! Hastiin turned out to be a

miniature ringer machine!! He was joyful, energetic....he threw a sweet flip with "American" horseshoes....he threw ringers with seemingly without a thought or care in the world. (they say 1976 World Champion Carl Steinfeldt designed the American horseshoe....he would have loved to watch the Hastiin ringer show!) His first game was against Delia Garza...a sweet, motherly woman....a nice first game for the youngster....he threw a 47.5 at the nice lady, and beat her by ten points...oh well, Delia was just warming up. Next, Hastiin played Mike Hammer, the top 40footer in the tournament.....surely Mike could handle this youngster...he's a teacher! Hastiin dropped a 62five bomb on Mike, and beat him by 45 points....oh my!! Casey and Gail Sluys were at the tournament, and about that time Casey turned to Gail and said, "who does he remind you of?...and Gail without taking her eyes away from another Hastiin ringer, and with a slight smile said, "just like Travis." Bill Faler was next up for young Mr. Begaye...Bill came in to the tournament at 52.5%, number one in the group....surely the relaxed old veteran would stop this kid. Bill tossed 50% at Hastiin....Hastiin threw a 57-five back at him! Next up was a heartwarming sight...this was the perfect example of how ours is a lifetime sport.....7 year old Hastiin against 84 year old NCHPA Hall of Famer Don Kies....where but in horseshoes could you find competitors with a 77 year old age difference? I think Don must have put the old "Kies Freeze" on him....slowing the 7 year olds game down to an 84 year olds pace! The cagey old pitcher's strategy gave him a two ringer victory margin over Hastiin who threw his

tournament low of 40%. Hastiin bounced back, throwing a whole lot of "Motel 6s" at Turlock's Ken Weir, and although K-Dub tried to "leave the light on", the youngster hit him with a 47-five, and put his lights out with a 25 point loss! Next it was my turn...hey, I was undefeated at that point....Hastiinn had a loss....I had thrown a 60% game, and a 62.5 % game that day....all I have to do is stay cool and beat the kid and win the tournament. As Waylon would say.....Wrong!! Hastiin lit into me....at 20 shoes he was pitching 70 %, and I folded like a beach chair. When the smoke cleared the lad had thrown a 57-five at me, and I couldn't answer the bell!....and I thought that this was supposed to be an easy game from 30 feet! Mercifully, we had determined that there would be no playoff games that day....otherwise he would have probably humiliated me again! Hastiin's 52% percent for the day gave him the tournament win. Actually that was the most fun I have ever had losing a game! I never enjoyed taking a beating any more than that! Hastiin is a great young man, with a real future in this game. He has such a great little spirit, it was a joy to compete with him. I think everyone at the tournament that day enjoyed watching him pitch, knowing that they were witnessing something special! After the tournament I told Hastiin's Dad, Gavin, what a great kid he had for a son. Gavin said it was because he had such a great Mom. Hastiin's Mom, Bobie, watched the tournament from a courtside shade tree with Hastiin's 5 and 3 year old brothers.

Hastiin and his family come from Auberry, a small town in Fresno County, 40 miles NE of Madera, where they belong to the Madera Horseshoe Club. Harlen and Sharon Rippetoe call Hastiin the "Pride of the Madera Club", and rightly so! Hastiin plays baseball, basketball, and soccer, and is a star in all of them. He's a good

student, and his Dad say he is known as a kind and helpful classmate. Hastiin started pitching horseshoes when he was three years old from 10 feet, and he made ringers! The Begayes are a horseshoe family. Mom, Bobie qualified at 49 %, Dad Gavin is at 32%. The Begaves pitch as a family, regularly holding family tournaments in their backyard pits, which can even include Gavin's mom, who occasionally wins the tournament! Gavin laughs that he will look outside on a 100 degree day, and there is Hastiin and his brother pitching horseshoes in the heat. The sky seems to be the limit for Hastiin's horseshoe pitching future, whose first NHPA tournament game was 58%! Hastiin looks forward to competing in the California State Tournament in the Cadet division in Stockton over Labor Day. He was too late to get into the World Tournament in St. George, but the family plans to go to Utah where Hastiin hopes to pitch as a Pacer in the Cadet Division....what a great experience that will be for the Begayes!

Last weekend, Hastiin had the chance to pitch against 6-time Men's State Champion and NCHPA Hall of Famer Rick Bermingham. In their game, they both pitched 56 % ringers, and both of them enjoyed the game very much. I spoke with Rick tonight and he went on about Hastiin, calling him a gifted young pitcher...something special! Rick said that Hastiin has what it takes if he will stay with it.....saying in his 35 years of horseshoe pitching he hasn't seen a young pitcher come along with this much talent! Rick also said that Hastiin brought to mind Walter Ray Williams, Jr., who won his first State Junior Title in 1970 at age 10, and his first World Junior Title in 1971 at age 11. At age 7, Hastiin certainly has a bright future! What a great kid, from a great family, and what a great thing for the FUTURE of Horseshoe Pitching! George Davis

Fortuna

There are a few members that might be able to bring a small tractor with a loader and backhoe or other equipment that would be a big help. 
