I would like to announce that the State Tournament will be held in Bakersfield although hosted and managed by NCHPA. This was a difficult decision to make. With the closing of the Yolo facility, NCHPA had to secure a site that had enough courts for a tournament of this caliber, along with having lights and that is affordable. Attempts were made by Leon Moore from the San Jose Club to negotiate with the City of San Jose to use the courts, however, the cost was prohibitive along with other conditions that would have been imposed. My gratitude and thanks to Leon for his efforts. In this economic climate, it would have been a poor business and financial decision by the Board to enter into contract with the City of San Jose. The Board evaluated other locations but none met the criteria that were needed to successfully host tournament.

Your support and understanding is appreciated, as we know you were looking forward to the State Tournament being held in Northern California. If you will please share this email with your members via email and at tournaments it would be helpful. Furthermore, if you have suggestions for Northern California sites for future State Tournaments - please don't hesitate to contact me. Thank you.

Statisticians Report

However we were able to get in 43 tournaments. In those tournaments we had 904 pitchers who made 57,618 ringers while pitching 201,052 shoes.

Only 3 NCHPA pitchers reported pitching in 6 Arizona tournaments, Fritz Oberst, David Loucks and Ken Woolery. Two of our members, Rick Della Santina and Richard Robbins pitched in a tournament in Hawaii. We had 33 members pitch in tournaments in Southern California. If anyone else pitched in out of state tournaments, you need to let me know.

Thirteen teams participated in the Team Tournament at Pleasanton. I have to mention the winning team Fortuna, not because as an associate member I ended up pitching with that team, but because of the great day Ken Woolery had on Sunday. His low game was 55.00%, a 57.50% game, a 72.50% and 77.50% game, Two 80.00% games and one 82.50% game. His tournament total was 72.10%. We should all hope for a tournament average like that. 
