Having 13 of the 23 possible delegates 57% required to proceed with the meeting, as required by our By-Laws, this meeting was called to order by President Summers at 9:40 AM.

#### **MINUTES**

The meeting was called to order at 9:32 AM by **President Summers** followed by the Pledge to our Flag and moment of silence for those who passed in 2020. The 2019 Minutes and Financial Reports were presented by Sec/Treas Gail Sluys each was reviewed and voted on for acceptance as presented. Motions carried. Discussion of the continuation of the Club Plaque distribution was discussed. It was suggested the same method was used as in the past. Clubs will receive 2 plaques free and any others needed after that will cost \$20.00 each. Motion was presented and passed to continue this method. We have a new source for tournament plates at a cost of \$3.00 each, saving \$1.00 each from last year. The business name is 123 Awards complete order information to follow. The plates will have double sided tape and not holes for hanging. The color for the 2021 plates is BLUE. We have a list to follow for each year starting in 2020 was green, blue, red, black, then we start again with greed. We will follow this line each year as was decided at the 2019 meeting.

President Joe Summers reported that the Covid 19 virus had caused numerous tournaments to be cancelled in 2020. Many courts will need attention in 2021 and he is asking all members to step up and help at your local club and others if you can. The Fortuna Club is closing and will not be hosting any tournaments in 2021. We may need to combine some clubs as we have done in the past with the difficulty some are having with their city parks.

1<sup>st</sup> VP George Davis reported we had 34 new members some of them returning members and all were sent the Welcome Letter. Twelve joined the Sonoma County Club mainly brought in by Paul Machado. Delegates were reminded if you have a brand new member to please get the color of shirt and size they would like for the NHPA welcome program as it is still in effect. George also reminded everyone that we will be hosting the 2021 State Tournament at Stockton. We will need a lot of help to get the courts in shape and all we can get will be very much appreciated. Please remember this is our premier event.

2<sup>nd</sup> **VP** Alan Trusty had nothing to report.

Statistician 3<sup>rd</sup> VP Mike Anderson reported the clubs held 61 tournaments this year with 67 cancelled. 727 Pitchers pitched in the tournaments, 27 pitched in the NCHPA Championships and 6 teams pitched in the Doubles Championships. Sixty (60) people from other places also pitched in NCHPA tournaments, for total pitchers of 847. Mike generously donated his officer comp and statistician compensation to the NCHPA again this year. Thank you Mike we will put it to good use.

RD Casey Sluys reported on the NHPF Hall of Fame building is closed due to the Virus. He asked everyone to remember to send him information/articles about your club. These articles will be used for print in the NCHPA Newsletter which he has continued to send out quarterly. He reported the NHPA business meeting was held this year via Zoom which worked well since we were unable to hold our World Tournament and delegate

meeting in person. He reported that Blaine Scott is the new Newsline Editor. Things are changing for the reporting of tournaments if you want to see the memberships and schedule of tournaments it will all be on E-Shoe. You can get to E-Shoe by going to the NHPA webpage – go down to the E-Shoe Icon and effective January 1, 2021 you will be able to look at the information located there. NatStats will be going away as you see it now. In order to update averages you will go to E-Shoe to download current averages. As tournaments are input pitchers will be immediately re-rated. Therefore your average could change from one day to the next but it is not expected that TD's could update averages from day to day. This will be interesting and hopefully it will all be a good thing. More information will be sent to all club contacts and tournament directors as it is received and decided. This change will become effective January 1<sup>st.</sup>

Peter Zepponi of our San Francisco Club explained to all about Luke's high school horseshoe pitching club. During the club meetings instructions are give to the members so they may improve their pitching and learn more about the game. San Francisco may hold their tournaments at the Stern Grove courts. Access to these courts is much easier than Golden Gate Park and they will be open for tournaments on Sundays. Stern Grove courts are located at Sloat Blvd and  $22^{nd}$  Avenue in San Francisco.

NCHPA Hall of Fame. - Linda Hoelscher, Chairperson reported that the Hall of Fame committee did not induct anyone into the NCHPA Hall of Fame this year.

Dave Lane informed everyone about the online tournaments held this year. He said there were a lot of fun sanctioned tournaments you could pitch in your own backyard or local courts to join. Jerry Smith also ran several of these tournaments successfully. They were held by different people in different states and had very good turnout which you could see if you belong to Facebook. These were a good source of tournaments where we were unable to host the normal number of tournaments.

A reminder was given to all clubs that the Club Contact duties are very important. Please make sure the schedule director has your club contact information and it is correct. A reminder- we are hosting the State Tournament in 2021 and will need all clubs to resume their contribution of \$45.00 per year. Of this amount #25.00 is for the state raffle prizes and \$20.00 for possible raffle prizes at the Annual meeting and luncheon. Vallejo has paid their \$25.00 for the State raffle.

The 2021 CA State Tournament location is Stockton Horseshoe Courts.

The 2021 NorCal Championships host was selected as Vallejo Club.

The 2021 Doubles Tournament host was selected as Vallejo. It will be the same weekend as the NCHPA Championships which are held on Saturday, we are hoping pitchers will plan to stay or return on Sunday for the fun Doubles Championship.

The 2021 Annual Meeting location is not known at this time. As we have found out in 2020 planning that far ahead doesn't work sometimes. The 2021 location will be announced as soon as we have decided on a location.

Happy Holidays to everyone. I wanted to have Casey put this information about Eshoe and HSMaster training videos in the newsletter in case you do not get or read the NHPA "Newsline." Here is a stripped-down version of my Newsline article. Eshoe was introduced in 2019 for membership and made tracking our membership easy and One can sign up for their accurate. membership and get an NHPA card online. The NHPA no longer prints cards as members print their own cards or have the charter's membership official do it. process was a bit confusing to some folks but after a few bugs were worked out, it went well. Step two of the Eshoe was introduces this year and the upgrade goes hand in hand with the re-write of HSMaster. This step integrates Eshoe and HSMaster and will eliminate what is now NATSTATS. NATSTATS will end on the last day of 2020 all data that was contained in NATSTATS will be in Eshoe. The general plan is for the Regional Director or the charter's designee to enter the charter's schedule into Eshoe. Anyone can access any charter's schedule at any time. charter Statistician or designee will enter tournament results into Eshoe and Eshoe will immediately update each pitcher's stats and averages. The league process will continue as it does now. I have been working with the Eshoe team and the team has produced a series of videos to explain how the new system works. Paul Stewart, David Sidles, and Jim Kinney Jr. made the videos, and they explain the various positions that a charter may choose to use. The charters will decide how they want to implement the system and I am listing here a link to those videos. This link also lists a very comprehensive set of videos on how to

run and use HSMaster. Paul Stewart started making these videos and with the help of David Sidles, and they have covered HSMaster from stem to stern. Understand that the videos are a work in progress and may be upgraded as needed. This is a noticeably short explanation of a complex system and the videos will clear up how it works and who might be responsible to implement it. Again, each charter will decide how they want to handle things. Here is the link.

## San Francisco

Yesterday (12/7) San Francisco entered Covid-19 lockdowns again which is very discouraging. It's really hard trying to plan for public promotion of the sport with these restrictions, but we are looking ahead to 2021. The landscaping improvements are ongoing around the Golden Gate Park courts and look good. Our improvements to the Stern Grove courts are continuing as well. These courts are next to the tennis courts, which have been restriped to allow for up to 6 pickle ball courts where people

play 7 days a week. On weekends there might be over 30 people there. I have played pickle ball with and gotten to know many of these people which provides opportunities to talk about horseshoes and I've even pitched with a couple. The high school horseshoe club bbq's and plays horseshoes nearly every week next to these pickle ball courts so it is good exposure.

Before the recent lockdowns, I was starting to plan for some recreational tournaments to help support local bars or breweries who are struggling. Rather than a large tournament, I'm looking at smaller events that can more easily follow safety precautions. The concept is a prix fix tournament picnic sponsored by one or two venues or brewers. Some of the local pubs make food so the idea is to see if a sponsor could take signups for a tournament that includes a set picnic bag lunch and drinks (beer) for a fixed price of \$50 (?). The SFHPC would run the tournament. That's the basic concept. Bars and pubs are getting killed with the lockdowns. This might be a way to help them stay connected to their customers and promote horseshoes. I bet every town has a bar or restaurant that might be willing to partner with your local horseshoe club. I am planning on running these as fun recreational tournaments with loose rules. Everyone is getting tired of living with strict rules. This could be a good opportunity to reintroduce people to a fun outdoor game of horseshoes and a bit of normalcy.

It's important that everyone continues to promote the sport and look for opportunities to bring in new members and educate those that don't know about it. Even little things. Attached is an essay Luke Zepponi wrote for his Ap English Class for a debate. Most kids picked a political topic. He chose to argue the case for making horseshoes an Olympic Sport. Now 30 more kids know a lot more about the sport of horseshoe pitching. There are not that many juniors in the NCHPA, but of the ones pitching there are some exceptionally good pitchers. We should all be encouraging our kids and grandkids to get out and pitch with their friends, socialize and to talk about their experiences. Right now, there are no school basketball games, no football, no volleyball, no wrestling. Luke Zepponi Ms. Gratch Ap Language and Composition 12/3/2020

Hello, my name is Luke Zepponi and today I will be arguing a topic that doesn't have too much awareness, but the people that are active and involved will agree with what I am talking about. My topic is why Horseshoe Pitching should be an Olympic Sport. Horseshoes is a very fun and competitive sport that brings people together from friends and family to across the world, but mainly the United States. In order to excel at this sport, you will need to practice a great amount just like in any other sport. One of the key factors that you will need to gain through practice that will help you is having a clear mind and learning to perform well and consistently under pressure. I put both of these factors into all of my games whether it is a game where I am just messing around with friends or in the finals during the World Tournament while being filmed on the local news channel. You have to stay calm and focused at all times or else you will become stressed and will over think when it is your turn to pitch. At the highest levels of the sport minor variations in accuracy, consistency, and technique are the difference in who wins or loses. Some of the things that I will be highlighting are the strategies in order to perform well, how horseshoes can be played by anyone and anywhere, and finally some of horseshoes' history.

There are many extremely difficult and frustrating things that will come your way while trying to get the perfect momentum, the perfect grip, and the perfect follow-through that will make you succeed, and once you have mastered these few strategies you will become very good and confident every time you come up to the line to pitch. Stamina, endurance and compensating for fatigue are essential to succeed because you will be throwing nearly three pounds of steel 40 feet several hundred times in a row while maintaining precision and form. While this doesn't seem like much, it is similar to curling a 5 lb weight. It is easy the first 20 or 30 times, but if you were to do it 600 times in a row it would be very hard. Then consider the top players in the world maintain a 90% ringer average while their opponent is trying to stop them from scoring is extremely difficult. This is why I think horseshoes should be in the Olympics because of how much skill is needed based on your mental focus, hand and eye coordination you need to have, and knowing all the little things such as your grip on the horseshoe, your backswing, your follow-through, and your step and release point.

The spirit of the Olympics is about sports competition that is accessible to people around the world regardless of climate or economic resources. At the most basic level, it only requires two metal stakes and four horseshoes. It is played in several countries and by soldiers currently stationed in the middle east because it is so easy to set up a game. The sport of horseshoes is played by kids, men, women and players in their 90's. It is also a sport that easily adapted to players with disabilities or physical limitations. For this reason, it would also be able to be included in the Special Olympics and Paralympics. It is a part of the Senior Games, as well as the California Fire Fighters Olympics.

The origins of horseshoes date back to the second century BC in Olympic games of Greece and Rome. The modern history of horseshoes dates to the Revolutionary War in 1869. The first rules of the game were established in England where it was decided that the distance in between the two stakes would be 19 yards and players had to stand next to the stake when pitching. These were the rules that lasted until 1909. Soldiers took a liking to the game during war, and when they returned home, they started to spread the word about pitching horseshoes and then horseshoe courts were built all over hundreds of farmland areas, villages, and cities. The first ever horseshoe tournament was in the summer of 1910 in Kansas and won by a man named Frank Jackson. The first ruling body of horseshoe pitching of which any record was found was in Kansas City, Kansas, May 16,1914.
