The World Tournament was held in Kennewick, Washington from July 29-August 3rd. The tournament was a one-week event this year. Kennewick is part of an area called the Tri-Cities area in Southcentral Washington, located on the Columbia River, with a population of 85,000. In the 1940's, the Hanford Site was built by the US Government near Kennewick; the site was part of the Manhattan Project which developed the Nuclear Bombs which ended World War Two. People were recruited from all over the country to work at the Hanford Site, only being told that their work would help the country in the war effort, not being told that they would be producing Plutonium, which was used to build the Fat Man bomb, which was dropped on Nagasaki, Japan in 1945.

Seventy-nine years after the Fat Man Bomb was dropped on Nagasaki, the NHPA Horseshoe Bomb was dropped on the Toyota Center in Kennewick! The horseshoe pitching was held in two buildings, the Toyota Center Building and the Toyota Arena.

Alan Francis repeated as the NHPA Men's World Champion for the 28th time! A truly remarkable feat in dominating a sport over such a long period of time! It's such a shame that Alan has not achieved fame and fortune he deserves for his incredible achievements! In the Championship Round Alan was a perfect 15-0, pitching a spectacular 85.83% ringer percentage. In his third game, Alan threw 34 straight ringers for a perfect game; his opponent threw over 55% ringers and didn't score a point! Francis' low game was a 73.21% effort! Amazing!

California, and particularly the Northern California Charter was well represented in the Men's Championship Finals. Four California pitchers were in the elite final 16 pitchers vying for the World Title. **Dalton Rakestraw** from Southern California had a great 5th place finish, going 10-5, with a ringer percentage of 66.19. **Nathan Williams** finished in 7th place, going 8-

7 with a 63.95 %, giving him an outstanding top-ten finish. **Rick Bermingham**, and **Bobby Bartell** represented Norcal finishing 14th and 15th with 4-11 records. Both Rick and Bobby had to be disappointed to pitch well below their entry averages.

The Women's Championship Group had no California pitchers. Penny Steinke of Wisconsin is the new Women's World Champion. Penny upset two-time defending Champion Sarah Chaffee, also of Wisconsin in a playoff. Penny had to take two games in a row from Sarah, and she did so convincingly, 41-25, and 40-10. Penny averaged 77. 05% with her 1 1/4 turn for the Championship Finals. Penny is a kindergarten teacher who has authored over twenty children's books including one entitled The ABC's of Horseshoes. It should be an interesting Women's Championship Group Wisconsin State Championship Tournament over Labor Day in Wausau, WI; a rematch of the Women's World Championship match, Penny vs. Sarah!

In the Senior Men's Championship Ken Fraser of New York was the winner, going undefeated and pitching 70.18%. Walter Ray finished 3^{rd,} averaging 61.89%. Norcal's Ramiro Coronado finished 7th place.

Sheila Sheppard of Colorado won her 10th Senior Women's Championship, going 7-0 while averaging 55%. Tulare's **Diane Luiz**, our California Women's Champion, finished second at 5-2, pitching 54.71%. Diane will eventually break through and win that division!

The Elder's Championship was won by Canada's **Tom Moffat**, who had only one loss and pitched a sparkling 77.22%.

Hastiin Begaye of the Madera Club won the Junior Boy's Championship with a perfect 7-0 record, and an outstanding 77.10 %. **Adakai Begaye** finished in 8th.



Southern California's **Lily Strong** won the Junior Girls Championship, going 5-1, with a respectable 50.85%.

The Cadet Boy's Title went to **Gavin Begaye**, **Jr**., who went 5-0, tossing 58.5% ringers. **Eben Begaye** was 3rd place.

Missouri's **Addisyn Goddard** took the Cadet Girl's Championship.

3rd VP Northern California Pitchers made their mark on the 2024 World Tournament. The following is a recap of Norcal Pitchers' highlights:

In Men's B, **Dave Lane** finished in 14th place, but he managed to beat Sarah Chaffee's Dad!

In Men's C, **Cesar Espinola** had a nice 3rd place finish, going 11.5-3.5, throwing 42.5%, 3.06 % over his entering average. Cesar had a high game of 57.5%. Wayne Lockhart went 9-6 to finish 6th.

Willows' **Lance Taylor** finished 3rd place in Men's D, by going 9-4, and averaging 40.38%, 6.15% over his entry average. Lance tossed a high game of 5i7.5%. Sacramento's Rick Thompson went 5-8 to finish 11th, throwing a pair of 47.5% games.

In Men's F, **Manuel Mix** of Chico finished 3rd with a 9-4 record, Gold Country's **Gene Washoe** finished 7th, and Gold Country's **Marshall Merino** took 9th place.

In Men's I Merced's **Tony Smullen** was 7^{th} , at 6-7.

In Men's K Atwater's **Loren Doffee** was 8th, at 2-7.

In Women's D, Willows' Lisa Dicharry finished in 11th place with a 4.5-8.5 record, with a nice 35% game in her second game.

Robert Gillett Sr. was 3rd in Sr. Men's C class, going 9-2. Jeff Williams finished 12th. Jeff kept himself busy at the tournament videoing a number of games, which can be currently seen on YouTube, a great contribution to promoting our sport!

In Senior Women's C, San Leandros' **Estrellita Boggess** finished second at 9-2, throwing 5.06 % over her entering average. 1977's California Women's State Champion Marisela Mauricio finished in 4th place at 7-4.

Ukiah's **Gil Tournour** finished 2nd place in the Elder's C Class. Gil had a record of 11.5-3.5 with a 54.33% ringer average, 4.76% above his entering average! Gil threw three 65% games, and pitched 75% in beating the pitcher that won the class, 39-4! Should Gil have been in the Elder's Championship Group, or what?

In Elder's D, **Rick Della Santina**, Northern California's newest Hall of Famer, finished 8th at 4-7.

Lincoln Club's **John DeMello** dominated Elder's F! John went 12.5-0.5 with 44.81% ringers, 4.53 % above his entering average. DeMello had a sweet 57.5% high game!



Les Smullen finished 7^{th} , at 7-6, in Elders G.

I floundered in 11th place in Elders H, trying to learn to throw a flip, burdened by an entering average which was a remnant of the days when I could throw a turn and make some ringers!.

Tri-Valley's **Richard Robbins** absolutely "tore-up" Elders I with a 12.5-0.5 record. My brother calls Richard "The Mayor" of the World Tournament, because he seems to be best friends with 90% of the pitchers. Well, the Mayor averaged 34.04% ringers, and threw two 42.5% games to totally dominate the class! Richard usually wins the World Tournament in odd years, but decided to make an exception in 2024!

Bill Boggess of San Leandro won big in Elders L! Bill won 13.5 games and tied 1, pitching 31.07% ringers (which was 4.25 points above his entry average) Bill had a high game of a loud 47.5%

Ron McBroom of Elk Grove came in 5th place at 6.5-4.5 in Elders M, and Jeff Vieira finished 11th.

The NHPA Convention was held on Sunday, August 4th. Ben Webb of Kentucky was elected NHPA President.

The NCHPA 2023-2024 season started immediately after Labor Day 2023 and as of July 8 2024 NCHPA has pitched 72 tournaments (thru 03-24-065) and cancelled/postponed 16 tournaments. Nine hundred and thirty-two NCHPA pitchers and 29 non-NCHPA pitchers have pitched in our tournaments to date. Stay healthy and keep on a' pitchin'!

Now that we are using eShoe you club statisticians may now upload your tournament statistics (if using HSMaster) directly to eShoe any time after your tournament is complete, but still email must me (meanderson99@yahoo.com) the commaseparated-values Results file (1 per tournament), the Class Boxscore

files (1 per tournament class), and the All Class Standings Results file (1 per tournament) for my work. If you do not care to upload your tournament statistics to eShoe yourself then I will be glad to do it for you. Just let me know that you would like for me to do it. The files that you send me are the same files that I have always asked for you to send me. And please be

sure that the box score files that you send are generated in HSMaster as Tournaments,

Reports, Format, Results [not Results (Brief)]. Keep in mind that I need to see member numbers in every file that you send. That means I want the long version, not brief version, of every file. Note that for doubles tournaments HSMaster will produce only the brief version of the Class Box score files and the All Class Standings Results file. These files can be produced in HSMaster by:

A bunch of other Californians also drove or flew to Washington and we all gathered at the Toyota Center, the Toyota Arena and the Three Rivers Convention Center to pitch and watch the intense competition on the pits.

It was a delightful experience. We saw a lot of new and unfamiliar country - so much wheat, corn, hay and alfalfa and miles and miles of wind machines (the kind that create power) and lots of beautiful tree-covered mountains - it was a pleasure!

Our journey took us to the beautiful Columbia river, it's huge! and so I asked SIRI and this is what I learned: the river begins in British Columbia and goes through Washington and for a long way follows the border between Washington and Oregon then after a journey of 1270 miles it empties into the Pacific Ocean.
