## Statistician

Several times last year I informed our members that if they pitched in tournaments outside the State of California they needed to send the information to me. Since November of last year, I have received two reports from Fritz Oberst on two tournaments he pitched in Arizona. I did not receive any information from any other members. I do not know if no one else pitched in other states or if they just forgot to send the information to me.?????

Sometimes keeping the stats for the NCHPA gets to be very frustrating. When I send results of tournaments to NATSTATS I have to make sure that all of the membership numbers are correct. I cannot send any results for people who pitched but do not yet have a membership number. Sometimes people join the NCHPA and pitch in their first tournament the day they join. This will slow the process of posting the results until membership numbers are obtained for those new members. That is why it is important to get their dues and information to Gail Sluys as fast as possible.

So far this year we have added 38 new members and have had 26 members change clubs. When they change clubs, their membership numbers change. All these corrections need to be made before I send information to NATSTATS. I think we all got spoiled when Glenn Jamison was running NATSTATS. I could assign a fictitious number to the member with no number yet and when Gail assigned the number Glenn and I would change our records. This is no longer possible.

I want to relay a problem I had with the first tournaments of the year in Tulare. It is not my intent to give the Tulare Club a hard time about the problems we had. They have worked with me trying to get everything fixed. When I received the results there were 10 new members who pitched and did not have a number yet. There were 4 members whose numbers were wrong. There were a man and woman whose numbers were switched. ◇ **State Champions** will be declared in the divisions described below. ◇

**OPEN:** Men (40 ft.) and Women shall enter "OPEN MEN" or "OPEN WOMEN" divisions. Pitchers eligible as Seniors may also choose to pitch in the "OPEN" division. ELDERS short distance (30') cannot.

**SENIORS:** Pitchers 60 years of age and over (EXCEPT ELDERS) may participate in either the "OPEN" or "SENIOR" divisions, but not both. Senior Men/Senior Women Division entrants may be moved to open divisions if the number of entries and/or the % spread does not allow for competitive groups.

**ELDERS:** Any male 70 years and older or physically impaired person of any age who have an established short distance (30') average may enter the ELDER short distance (30') division.

**JUNIOR:** "JUNIOR BOY" and "JUNIOR GIRL" divisions will be formed for pitchers whose 19th birthday does not fall in 2011. "CADETS" are junior pitchers whose 10th birthday does not fall in 2011.

⇒ Eligibility requires **Adults** have pitched in **three (3)** California sanctioned tournaments- **Junior and Cadet** pitchers require **one (1)** since **August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010**.

⇒ Pitching averages will come from NATSTATS.

⇒ Entry **Deadline** is **August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011** (Late entrants will be used on a standby basis, and will pay an additional fee of \$10).

⇒ **ADULT ENTRY FEE \$25/JUNIORS FREE. No refunds after August 8<sup>th</sup>, 2011.**

**LOCATION: Tri-Valley Club**

1. ENTRY FEE: \$80 per team. This is a **2-day event** and **pre-registration is required**.
2. Teams may be mixed, may include juniors (but may not be all juniors), and must have 4 players per team. Each team may register 1 alternate player to be used in case of injury.
3. All players must be NCHPA members and be a member or associate member of the club they represent. **All participants must wear a shirt of the club they represent and have their name neatly on the back.**
4. Day One Tournament play will consist of 7 - 30 shoes, count-all games using an 80% handicap. We will need to have scorekeepers, therefore, a final decision has not yet been made to pitch all teams at once or in two shifts. Pitching times for Saturday will be **10:00 A.M. & 12:30 P.M.** – depending on the number of entries a final decision will be made about the pitching schedule when we know how many teams are signed up. The finals will consist of the top 8 teams from the Saturday's rounds carrying over totals and will be played at 9:30 A.M. Sunday. Finals will be 7 - 40 shoe, count-all games using an 80% handicap with 20 bonus points for each player win and 40 bonus points for each team that wins 3 or more games in any single round. The 2-day points total including bonus points will determine final standings. All teams should plan to play on Sunday because the first alternate team will replace any team not able to return for the finals.
5. Prize money will be determined by the number of teams entered and will be announced.

**It would be great to have 24 teams fielded. Each day will count as a separate tournament because they are played under different formats. Pitchers are required to pay scorekeepers .50 cents per game each day.**

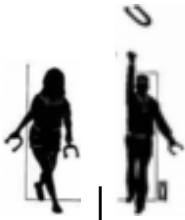
