NCHPA Annual Meeting Minutes November 11, 2017 Florin Rebekah Hall Sacramento CA

No Delegates: Exeter: Forebay Park: Gold Country: Indian Valley: San Francisco: Tulare: and Tuolumne Clubs were not represented. Feather River Club whose members have now announced their disbandment was also not in attendance.

MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 by President Joe Summers who welcomed members, led the Pledge of Allegiance and asked for a moment of silence for members who have passed this year.

With 23 votes available to the delegates a simple majority will be 12 and a 2/3 will require 15 votes to pass. If paper votes necessary Linda Hoelscher, Rick Della Santina and Gil Tournour will collect and count the votes.

Self introductions of NCHPA officers followed. Secretary/Treasurer Gail Sluys performed the roll call and delegate count. The minutes to the 2016 meeting were presented and a motion was made to accept the minutes as presented and with a second the motion passed. The 2017 Financial report was presented. A motion was made to accept the report and with a second the motion carried. George Davis 5th VP reminded everyone that John Barney was moving and he will be missed. He informed everyone he will be taking over handling supplies and club welfare until jobs were assigned in 2018. George also reported new and returning members for 2017 equaled 65. He reported that the Turlock club added 10 new members, Sonoma County 9 and Madera 8 making them the top clubs adding new members this year. Alan Trusty 3rd VP reported will assume a new set of duties after January 1st. Lorena Tournour 4th VP asked anyone having any changes to the 2018 schedule to contact her within a week so that she can get the schedule completed.

RD Casey Sluys reported on the World Tournament as he was the Chairperson for the NCHPA.

- NHPA raised Adult dues to **\$25.00** as voted on by the membership, making the total including NCHPA "35.00" per year effective in 2018. Junior dues remain \$7.00.
- NHPF will continue to receive a \$1 from the NHPA per member as stipulated in their By-Laws to assist in becoming a constructive, worthwhile asset for growing the memberships.
- He held small meetings, at World, to solicit ideas how to increase and retain membership nationwide. One was to have a possible 2 tiered membership. Have the NHPA become the go to source for all Charters for recruiting tools for everyone to use, perhaps wholesale changes need to be made.
- Anything that comes of this he will report in the Newsletter.

Club Reports: Turlock reported that one of their members brought in 7-8 members this year.

Madera – Harlen feels the NHPA shouldn't have raised dues and to keep the cost down in his club he will eliminate club dues. He also announced he will only allow pitching from 35 ft in his Wednesday Un-Sanctioned league. He said he has 100 pitchers on that night. He suggested to grow your league have friends bring friends. He is planning to have his 2018 tournaments on Friday nights weather is better and has a good turn-out. 10:30 am – 10:52 am break. Roll Call – all present as earlier.

Casey /Joe announced the Hall of Fame Storage Pod went away. The Hall of Fame is now in the basement of Gail and Casey. It had been mentioned in the Newsletter. Another comment about the Newsletter was recommended (don't know by whom) that Clubs should take the responsibility of printing the Newsletter for their members without computers. This should be done to save the NCHPA money.

Club Contact list – please be sure the person on the schedule contact list is able to handle the responsibilities that go along with it. If not the person should be changed. Gail Sluys to e-mail a form showing Club officers to each club to be completed. *This has been sent out via email.*

Linda Hoelscher said Shasta/Willows will be hosting more money tournaments in 2018. Last year Robert Gillette sponsored one adding \$500.00 to the prize money. She said Jeff Norried will be adding money in 2018 but she doesn't know the amount.

It was agreed that the Color of the 2018 plates will be Gold with black trim. After meeting with our provider we found this had to be changed due to pricing. Therefore the plates for 2018 will be black with gold printing.

Vallejo club will be the host to the 2018 NCHPA Championships Tournament.

Shasta/Willows club will be the host of the 2018 Doubles Championship. This tournament will be set up and run by the NCHPA Officers. A Motion to keep the entry fee at \$40.00 and raise the entering cap to 110 was made and carried. The NCHPA Doubles Championship will be held October 22nd and 23rd.

Tri-Valley club will be on the 2018 schedule as planned as but may be changed it the Fairgrounds make changes. Break 11:50 AM 12:00

Mike Anderson nominated as 3rd VP elected unanimously. Mike Anderson with the assistance of Leon Moore will assume the position of NCHPA Statistician.

Jeff Vieira elected to the 5th VP and Alan Trusty was moved to 2nd VP all unanimously.

The 2018 annual meeting is scheduled at Florin Rebekah Hall in Sacramento 9:30 a.m. November 10, 2018. Meeting adjourned 12:30 PM

Getting ready for a tournament takes a lot, I arrive at the pits and water, trim the edges, sweep or blow the clippings, and turn clay, and in some extreme cases pump any excess water out the pits from too much rain. At the start of the tournaments, uncover the pits, put out the shovels, fill the watering cans and put them out, place spray paint at each pit, put the flag up and help set tables up. During the games I help change out stakes that need to be replaced and refill the water cans. After the tournaments, I help clean up the area, cover any remaining pits, place everything back in the truck and haul it back to my house and store it until the next tournament. We are looking forward to 2018 and growing the club. 2017 had a lot of rainy weekends, but this year we're hoping to have better weather and getting more new people out playing horseshoes. We will continue to promote and support recreational community tournaments to keep exposing new people to the game and NHPA. As with all of us, it involves working with the rec and parks department to balance our NHPA club and the public who can reserve the courts. For the first year since we started the club we have been seeing multiple groups pitching and reserving the courts on the weekends. That means that the word is getting

out, but also creating a new problem of groups wanting to reserve the courts on the same day. Not a bad problem to deal with, but another thing to coordinate with the reservations department. NHPA tournaments are not big money makers, so our club needs to work closer with the reservations department to help promote private horseshoe events which do make money for the parks. Being able to balance both NHPA and Rec tournaments and working with the park is going to important to sustaining a club.

This year we submitted several NHPA rule proposals in an effort to promote NHPA as well as Recreational horseshoes and create a pathway for more people to be involved with the NHPA either through provisional memberships or 'drop in' tournaments fees. By some estimates over 100 million people have played horseshoes in the USA, and there are numerous rec and bar leagues with no affiliation to the NHPA. There needs to be some way for all these other people to be involved and associated with the sport of organized horseshoes. If nothing else, to at least create a database and receive the News and Views. We proposed the idea of a two tier membership system and associate or provisional memberships for members of these other groups to be associated with the NHPA, and be able to pay an additional drop in fee, like at the YMCA and be able to pitch in an NHPA We host and help with several tournament. community tournaments every year, but there is no way for any of these people to have any association with the NHPA except by becoming a full member. That is a huge missed opportunity. There are several people thinking similarly in other states and I understand more rule changes have been proposed this year than usual. Pay attention to the new rules proposal coming out of committee this year. Also speak up and have an opinion. Clearly some changes need to be made to not only stop the decline of membership but increase it. If the estimates are correct, there are millions of people who play horseshoes. The NHPA needs to create a system where everyone can be associated with the NHPA, not just the most dedicated. There needs to be a 'minor league' or 'Farm Team' system that people can join, with looser rules for everyone who just wants to play for fun. That's where most of the future champions will eventually come from.

This year our junior member Luke Zepponi was the CA State Junior Champion, and is now a two time state champion. We are trying to leverage that as much as possible to build the Junior Club and with media exposure. In June he was featured in San Francisco Magazine and has been able to use his horseshoe experience and success on high school applications. We hope to start a horseshoe club in whatever high school he ends up going to. Also this year we will try to create a SF Brewers league or tournament. Partnering with local breweries (or businesses) to create a fun rec league with sponsors will help us reach more potential new members and create additional revenue for the park and our club. If this league becomes successful, it would sure be nice if there was a way for them to be associated with the NHPA to get info about our tournaments, events and even be able to drop-in and play.
