been running HS Master for almost 4 years without electricity. So we can help you with any problem you might have. HS Master makes life easy when it comes to sending your tournament info to NATSTATS.

There have been some early discussions on how to settle tie breakers in a handicap group. Of course, win loss ties should be settled with a playoff game for first place. The traditional way of settling tie breakers in handicap groups was by points. The problem was that if you had two or more high average pitchers in that group, they would tend to cancel each other with ringers and not get many points, rightfully there are many points of view depending how the tie breaker that effects each player. I think we have an easy solution. The tournament director makes the call on how to settle

a tie breaker. If the TD determines that the tie breaker he chooses fits a group, then we have a common sense decision on a fair tie breaker.

I personally think the tie breaker should be head to head, and if you have a three way tie, then go to ringer percentage over average and then points. It would be nice if all are clubs would voice their opinions. You know my opinion but I would like to hear everyone's opinion so we could come to a mutual agreement for NORCAL Tournaments on settling tie breakers.
