Years ago I used to run heavy equipment building highways in the summer months and when I was off work in the winter, I purchased a portable sawmill and would manufacture lumber for people. They would have me come to their property and mill their trees into lumber. One day after milling logs on Vern's ranch, Vern came by the work site and invited me to stop by his house and have a drink before I drove (long distance) home. I was tired and told him, that I better get home. Vern said you have to have time for a drink and insisted, he was such nice person I could not turn him down. So I stop by his house and fixed me a highball and says, how about a game of horseshoes. He belonged to the Rio-Del horseshoe club, I did not know such a thing existed. So I went out and played a game with him, I might have got a couple ringers during the game and he tells me you can throw a ringer you better come down to Rio-Del this weekend and play in the tournament with us. Again I had trouble turning him down, went there to please him and ended up liking the pitching. To make a long story short Vern and Gwen Brightman, Bill and Sharon Paddock and Tom and Marilyn Webb would get in a car or two cars and head down the road, just about every weekend during the summer months to a horseshoe tournament. For us to make a weekend tournament, it is a minimum 400 mile round trip with many of the tournaments being 700 miles. Tom Webb won an award for traveling the most miles of any horseshoe pitcher, over the course of a year, pitching in Northern California. The more that I think about it, I bet he has the record for the most miles traveled and the most hours traveled of anyone in the Nation. *Bill Paddock*

SAN FRANCISCO

Since the weather has been so nice we started early with our 1st Saturday tournaments in Jan & Feb and have signed up 3 new members. On January we had a "Ring in the New Year" and in February in the spirit of Valentines Day we had a "Shoulda Put a Ring On It" tournaments.

We are making good progress on establishing the presence of horseshoe pitching in San Francisco! But things take time working with local government agencies as many of us know. I've heard several clubs talking about difficulties dealing with their local Parks & Recreation Departments. Trying to get a horseshoe club going in a historic venue in Golden Gate Park has not been, so to speak, a walk in the park. When I used to work for a large architecture firm in San Francisco young employees would come to me every year and ask for advice getting a raise. They'd tell me their woes, and why they need a raise, and how expensive everything is... And then I'd share a little secret with them: The bosses could care less about their problems. We all have our own problems. If you really want a raise or a promotion there are three things you must do during your annual review. 1) Tell your boss how you make him more money 2) Tell your boss how you make his job and life easier 3) Tell your boss why he is better off with you than without you. It's a simple formula that works. Everything is a two way street, and when you are asking for something, turn the table around an imagine sitting on the other side of it and ask yourself if you'd take the deal you were just offering. It may come as a shock to some of us, but horseshoe pitching is not one of the most glamorous and high profile sports out there. But it doesn't matter. Our clubs matter and they matter to the communities they serve. And it's our job to explain that to people. I've taken my

three principals and applied them to our club. When we started this in 2008, the courts had been abandoned for 20 years, were overgrown and a major homeless encampment with official talk of turning them into the park dump transfer station. All that was pretty bad.and all the more reason that the Park needed us. 1) How do we make them money? We clean up and reactivate the courts so they can be reserved and rented out. We have received grants, and donations, and 1,000's of hours of volunteer 2) How do we make their job easier? labor. encampments. Homeless drug use. and vandalism are a huge expense and problem, and the horseshoe courts were one of the worst locations in the park. Now they are occupied with horseshoe pitchers and those three issues have dramatically been reduced. 3) Why are they better off with us? Because WE care about We are there; we are maintaining our courts. them, using them, providing a community service, raising money, raising awareness, and all the other things we do.

On Saturday March 14, a non-profit I cofounded called the Friends of the Oak Woodlands, Golden Gate Park reached a milestone. The Oak Woodlands is a native presettlement old growth forest of coast live oaks. That is the forest in which the Golden Gate Park Horseshoe Courts are located. We created this organization as an umbrella organization for all of the different little sub community groups working in that area, including the SF Horseshoe Pitching Club. It is an official park partner with SF Parks Alliance, and we are able to channel park donations through them. But on March 14, 2015 we had a dedication ceremony to add the Oak Woodlands into the national Old Growth Forest Network. The SF Rec & Parks department issued a general media Press Release to all the news outlets talking about the history of the Oak Woodlands and the Historic Horseshoe Courts. Upon reading the press release the family of the artist who did the 'Horse' & 'Pitcher Man' sculptures contacted me to make a generous donation to assist in their restoration, and at the ceremony I was able to speak with senior park officials and get commitments to move forward with the restoration work we are doing. I make a point to

thank and support the park employees every opportunity I get and after nearly eight years they're starting to believe that we are on their side, and perhaps they are better off with a horseshoe club than a dump transfer station.

We are continuing our community outreach with two big events coming up. They are targeted to recruiting new horseshoe pitchers and volunteers, not necessarily NHPA members. (But you're welcome to come!)

On April 25 we are co-hosting the 1st Annual Ancient Eight - Ivy League Open Horseshoe Tournament & BBQ. We have partnered up with the SF Dartmouth Alumni Club who reached out to us to help with our park restorations. Rather than just one Ivy League University, I suggested they invite the other seven Ivy League University Alumni Associations to join them and send teams in order for us to reach a much broader audience. So now we also have teams from Yale and Cornell, and others that are interested. This is an Open Tournament to everyone, not just Ivy Leaguers, and we're planning a great BBQ as part of the \$15 entry fee to get as many people out as we can. It will be a nonhandicapped recreational Group Round Robin team doubles cancellation games to 21, where leaners COUNT as 2! Prizes TBD. The top team/s from each group will advance to finals. Detailed information and online registration is on our club website www.sfhorseshoepitching.com

To raise a little extra money and have some fun we are implementing a NEW RULE for the Ancient Eight tournament: Ringer Mulligans! Similar to Golf Tournaments, teams will have an option to BUY 1 point "Ringer Mulligans" before the Tournament. This will allow you to start off with a handicap advantage. It's impossible to handicap these open recreational games because most people are new to horseshoes and don't have an NHPA ringer percentage rating. This will give teams who think they need it an option to give themselves a bit of an edge. Of course all you Alan Francis's out there won't need them! ... but us backyard pitchers might! The Entry Fee is low for a Tournament AND full BBQ, so why not get yourself a little insurance for \$5!... but plan ahead and use them wisely! Ever had a day where you felt like you couldn't buy yourself a ringer? Well Not today!

Ringer Mulligan Rules: (Some other clubs might want to try it for non-NHPA tournaments)

- All Mulligans to be purchased BEFORE tournament play begins and recorded on the Tournament Flow Chart.

- Up to 6 'Mulligan' points MAX can be used per 21 point game.

- \$1 per Mulligan Point, to be used in the match(s) of your choice during the group round robin.

- "Two Ringers" for \$5 = 6 points, or \$1 per point.

i.e. Four Ringers for \$10 = 12 handicap points available for you to use.

- Must Declare use of Mulligans BEFORE the match starts and how many points you want to use for the match. (1-6 pts)

- If not declared BEFORE first shoe is tossed, NO Mulligans will be allowed! Call out the score, and THEN start pitching.

i.e. Before starting the game, if 6 points are used, call out "Score is 0 to 6." So everyone knows.

- NOT VALID in Semi Finals or Finals, only in the Round Robin Group phase. NO handicapping of the playoffs.-This is a cancellation tournament, so you can 'cancel' your opponents Mulligans, by using your own. i.e. If a team declares they want to use the max 6 pts mulligan against you, you can "cancel" those by applying 1 to 6 points of your own. If you used 2 Mulligan points the game would start with a score of 4 to 0 and go to 21. If you used 6 pts against their 6 pts the score would start at 0-0.

Has anyone ever heard someone say that there are not enough young horseshoe pitchers out there? Well we're hoping to recruit a few more! On May 16 my wife and another family are hosting an Old Skol Shoes 'N" Q! Public Elementary School Family Horseshoe Picnic and BBQ! This is the public elementary school our kids attend. We placed this item in our annual school auction fundraiser with 80 spots available and it SOLD OUT at \$35 per person! So we expect to have 80+ parents and their kids hanging out, picnicking, and playing horseshoes. Apparently some people still think a picnic and horseshoes sounds fun! You just have to invite them. If I were retired I think another good way

to get young pitchers would be to host a kid's summer horseshoe camp through the local Park & Rec Dept. I know all the working families around here are scrambling to find affordable activities to put their kids in during the summer while school is out. It might just be a couple hours a day or one of several activities the kids rotate through during the week. If you have the time and will be out there pitching anyway, talk to your park directors about being part of their youth summer programs. It might be a good way to get some new young members...and their parents.
