If you've answered yes to any of these do you realize that there is a foundation that exists that will provide all these thing for future generations of horseshoe pitchers? It is the NATIONAL HORSESHOE PITCHERS FOUNDATION it is yours, ours, horseshoes' It exists because of members like you who contribute to it. Your contribution to this foundation is 100% tax deductible. Not only will this foundation preserve the future, but it's also set to promote Junior programs, it can assist, through grants, with the rebuilding of a court facility or construction of new courts, provide educational assistance for pitching, the possibilities are endless as to what this foundation can do for us.
